Important Notice for Active Carpenters and Their Families About Their Prescription Drug Coverage and Medicare

Please read this notice carefully if you are eligible for Medicare or will become eligible for Medicare within the next 12 months. This notice has information about your current prescription drug coverage whether it be through Medco under the Trust's Fee-For-Service option or one of the Trust's HMO/EPO options, and about your options under Medicare's prescription drug coverage. This information can help you decide whether or not you want to join a Medicare drug plan. Information about where you can get help to make decisions about your prescription drug coverage is at the end of this notice.

1. Medicare prescription drug coverage became available in 2006 to everyone with Medicare. You can get this coverage if you join a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan or join a Medicare Advantage Plan (like an HMO or PPO) that offers prescription drug coverage. All Medicare drug plans provide at least a standard level of coverage set by Medicare. Some plans may also offer more coverage for a higher monthly premium.
2. The Trust has determined that the prescription drug coverage provided to active carpenters and their eligible dependents through the Fee-For-Service Plan or an HMO/EPO is, on average for all plan participants, expected to pay out as much as or more than the standard Medicare prescription drug coverage pays and is considered Creditable Coverage.

Because your existing coverage is, on average, at least as good as standard Medicare prescription drug coverage, you can keep this coverage and not pay a higher premium (a penalty) if you later decide to join a Medicare drug plan.

You can join a Medicare drug plan when you first become eligible for Medicare and each year from November 15th through December 31st. In addition, Medicare beneficiaries leaving or losing employer- or union-sponsored coverage may be eligible for a "special enrollment period" – this may allow enrollment in a Medicare prescription drug plan outside the regular annual enrollment period. You should compare your current coverage, including which drugs are covered at what cost, with the coverage and costs of the plans offering Medicare prescription drug coverage in your area.

If you decide to join a Medicare drug plan, your Trust coverage will not be affected. In most cases, your prescription drug coverage through the Trust will be primary to the Medicare drug plan which means the Trust's prescription drug coverage will provide its normal benefits.

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You should also know that if you lose your coverage with the Trust and don't join a Medicare drug plan within 63 continuous days after your current coverage ends, you may pay a higher premium (a penalty) to join a Medicare drug plan later.

If you go 63 continuous days or longer without prescription drug coverage that's at least as good as Medicare's prescription drug coverage, your monthly premium may go up by at least 1% of the base beneficiary premium per month for every month that you did not have that coverage. For example, if you go nineteen months without coverage, your premium may consistently be at least 19% higher than the base beneficiary premium. You may have to pay this higher premium (a penalty) as long as you have Medicare prescription drug coverage. In addition, you may have to wait until the following November to join.

Remember: Keep this Creditable Coverage notice. If you decide to join one of the Medicare drug plans, you may be required to provide a copy of this notice when you join to show whether or not you have maintained creditable coverage and whether or not you are required to pay a higher premium (a penalty).

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
